EU Initiative for Coal Regions in Transition

- Created in 2017 to address the unique contexts of coal regions
- Open forum gathering all relevant stakeholders to discuss common challenges and solutions
- Multi-stakeholder Dialogue (Working Groups and Annual Political Dialogue)
- Resource Materials: toolkits, guidelines and reports
- Technical Assistance: START (September 2019) and TARGET (November 2021)
- Peer to Peer encounters: ExchangeEU (November 2021)





START support facility

- Tailor made technical assistance for EU coal, peat and oil shale regions:
 - Strategy development
 - Project identification, prioritisation and development
 - Governance and planning
- Open procedure for applications
- 7 regions selected
- Complementary with other existing EC support efforts
- Targeted and needs-orientated expertise (circa 50 to 110 days per region)
- Co-creation approach, engaging closely with recipients of support

WEAKNESSES

- Demographic decline, especially in urban centres
- Unemployment and economic inactivity
- Low educational achievement
- Lack of businesses with higher added value
- Social deprivation
- Infrastructure (inter-regional / international)

OPPORTUNITIES

Business start-ups and expansion

Expanding rural settlements

- German investment / networking with German companies / marketing and awareness
- Greening of landscape and economy
- Renewable energy / energy transition
- New remote / ICT models of working
- Radical new narrative for sub-region

THREATS

- Social exclusion
- Future of urban centres
- Increasingly uncompetitive labour force
- Limited opportunities for young, ambitious or qualified persons
- Insufficient public and private action / investment / co-ordination



Linking local strengths and assets to 'external' opportunities:

- Attracting external investment
 - Terhills Tourism, Limburg (BE)
 - Fantanele-Cogealac Wind Farm, Dobruja (RO)
- Technology transfer
 - Dinopol packaging, Wielkepolskie (PL)
 - O'clock, Île-de-France (FR)
- Redeployment of public service employment
 - Relocation of public sector broadcasting, Manchester (UK)
 - Crichton University Campus, Dumfries and Galloway (UK)



Linking local strengths and assets to 'internal' opportunities:

- Entrepreneurship
 - GrowBiz, Perthshire (UK)
 - Coop cross-border business exchange, (EE & LV)
 - Cowocat-Rural, Catalunia (ES)
- Expansion and diversification of existing businesses (including anchor companies)
 - ZMW, Sumalki (PL)
 - PISMO Business Incubator, Sisak-Moslavina (HR)
 - BnM Brown to Green programme, Midlands (IE)



Linking local strengths and assets to internal opportunities:

- Social Economy
 - Ludgate Hub, Skibbereen (IE)
 - Across the Country, Cserehat and Zala (HU)
 - Oksigen Lab, Brusssels (BE)
- Involving citizens in planning and development
 - Vistula valley cultural and culinary brand, Kujawsko-Pomorkie (PL)
 - You have the energy, you have the power, Catalunia (ES)



Other considerations:

- Skills and training: address skills gaps and shortages in the current workforce and prepare the young for future opportunities
- Keeping money in the community: ensure that local public, private and residential expenditures are used to optimise local employment (e.g., Community Wealth Building)
- Profile and perception: many localities have reinvented how they are perceived externally



Lessons for the Sokolov-East micro-region

Partnerships:

- Local development involves many actors: public, private (SMEs, anchor companies, inward investors etc.) civil society organisations, residents
- Different scales of government and business need to be engaged: local, regional, national and international
- Creating internal and external linkages and networks is vital: a local economy is not an island

Learning:

• Policy and practice innovation is important: failures as well as successes will occur, learn from them





Lessons for the Sokolov-East micro-region

A locality needs local capacity for local development:

- Knowledge and foresight to understand the present and the future
- Develop a strategy and / or engage with strategy development processes
- Build partnerships and networking across diverse actors and across scales
- Communicate to build consensus, transparency, legitimacy and trust
- Accessing and co-ordinating resources (local, regional, national and EU)
- Identify, develop and implement projects
- Engage and co-creation with external expertise and public and private assistance



Building capacity in the Sokolov-East micro-region

Potential priorities for strengthening capacity in the micro-region ?

- Strategy implementation
- Optimise co-ordination, partnership working and networking
- Identify and optimise development possibilities and funding opportunities
- Address both urban and rural dimensions of local development
- Co-ordination and sharing of resources for development across the communities of the micro-region



Actions for the Sokolov-East micro-region

Potential priority actions for the micro-region ?

- Mobilise capacity for planning and delivery
- Develop collective understanding and acceptance of challenges and opportunities
- Develop a unifying vision for the Development of the micro-region
- Develop an action plan, prioritising projects / initiatives in the short and longer terms
- Develop a stakeholder engagement plan to engage, influence and lobby key actors at local, regional, national and international levels
- Deliver "early wins"
